 - The meeting was called to order at 3:30 PM.

 - There was a motion to amend the agenda.

- VII. SPECIAL BUSINESS
 - Lagrange Announcement
 - Chief of Staff Britton would like to speak to the Senate about Lagrange Society applications.
 - She informs the Senate about the opportunities they can be a part of as a member of the Lagrange Society.
 - Senator Gilliland asks how the Lagrange Society differs from various ambassador groups at the university.
 - Senator Hardin asks if you can pick when your specific on-call hours are.
 - Vice-President McGinnis asks what the application process looks like.
 - Chairwoman Rhoades asks when applications close. Matthew informs the Senate that it closes midway through March.
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz asks if you can lose points. Chief of Staff Britton informs here that you cannot lose points.

XV. OPEN DISCUSSION

- Homecoming Theme

 - Senator Hanback encourages a Lucky Lion Homecoming theme!
 - Matthew informs the Senate that we could center this Homecoming around this year being our last year playing at Braly!
 - President Mardis needs to submit our ideas tomorrow, so if you have any ideas between now and tomorrow, please feel free to reach out to her.
 - Senator Hardin thinks that having a theme about campus traditions would be fun!
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz believes that we could do something in remembrance of our campus lions.
 - Senator Moore thinks the theme should be Purple Legacy! No sign of gold anywhere.
 - Senator Hardin suggests "Purple Reign," like purple rain!
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz asks what the odds are of hard launching a new live lion at Homecoming this year.
- Student Activity Fee Proposal
 - Chief of Staff Britton encourages the Senate to ask questions about the Student Activity Fee, and a potential proposal to raise this fee.
 - Chairwoman Winston asks if the proposal involved would be incorporating FSL into the Student Activity Fee. Chief of Staff Britton responds that Ms. Anna Leigh Rossi came and presented the idea to the executive council, and then after further discussion, the executive council decided to table this proposal.
 - Chairwoman Hamilton asks why the School of the Arts had a huge chunk of their budget cut from the Student Activity Fee. Chief of Staff Britton replies that they are not spending the entirety of their budget, as well as not using the money they currently have for their allocated purposes. She informs the Senate that they receive additional money from their educational, operating, and in-state budgets.
 - Matthew informs the Senate that in addition to their allocated budget, the School of the Arts students also request money from the Student Allocation process.

- Senator Strait asks if there were any groups that received a significant increase in funds. Chief of Staff Britton replies that UPC would be receiving a significant increase.
- Senator Moore asks if there is any documentation stipulating that these organizations have set items, they must use their budget on. Chief of Staff Britton replies that she will be looking into this over the course of the next few days.
- President Mardis thinks that maybe we could look into decreasing the budget that the game room receives. She believes that they already have a large pool of money to pull from.
- Matthew says that 60% of the Student Activity Fee falls under his realm of expertise. He tells the Senate that if they have any questions or concerns about the Student Activity Fee, they can reach out to him.
- Chairwoman Rhoades motions to table this discussion. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
- Vice-President McGinnis encourages the Senate to reach out to Chief of Staff Britton regarding any potential questions or concerns about the Student Activity Fee,
- DIA Position Change
 - Senator Gilliland speaks to the Senate about potentially renaming and changing the position of DIA.
 - President Mardis believes that the Senate is an appropriate space for the DIA position and does not support changing the position and duties of the DIA position. She would like the students to know that we as a Senate value this position.
