XIV. NEW BUSINESS

- Annual Report
 - The annual report has to be presented at least three weeks before inauguration.
 - Historian Plunkett will be presenting the annual report to the Senate today!

- Elections Manual
 - Chairwoman Rhoades and Senator Joyner will be presenting the elections manual to the Senate today!
 - They explain the changes that were made, and why these changes were made.
 - Chairwoman Rhoades will be conferring with the Judicial branch to talk about some more potential changes.
 - The Senate commends them for all of their hard work!
 - There was a motion to pass the elections manual as presented. The motion was heard and properly seconded.

XV. OPEN DISCUSSION

- Informal Vote on SNAP Vehicles
 - President Mardis is presenting the quotes she has received for both the GEM e4 and e6 vehicles we are looking into purchasing to replace the SNAP golf carts.
 - There were questions during our last meeting about charging. These vehicles will charge in the same way that the golf carts are currently charged on campus.
 - The total cost of the GEM e6 vehicle is estimated to be \$33,141.24 USD.
 - President Mardis and Pro-Tempore Fitz will be trying to negotiate lower prices tomorrow.
 - The total cost of the GEM e4 vehicle is estimated to be \$29,191.76 USD.
 - She explains the reasoning behind how each vehicle could potentially benefit the students.

- Senator Hanback asks how many seats will be available in these vehicles that do not include the two drivers. President Mardis states that there are two drivers required to be in the SNAP vehicles, so these vehicle options include 2 seats or 4 seats for students.
- Chairwoman Rhoades believes that the GEM e6 would be the best option for us to purchase. This way, more students can be transported at one time. This also allows more room to be used in case students need to transport their things from one location to another.
- Senator Mwaura asks if SNAP will be expanded from one vehicle to two vehicles. President Mardis says that there will be two vehicles per shift, and there will be four SNAP drivers instead of two.
- Chairman McCuiston asks if SNAP vehicles will operate during football games at the new football stadium. President Mardis states that these vehicles will allow for the reach of SNAP to extend farther out from campus, which will include the new football stadium.
- Chief of Staff Britton believes that we should purchase the GEM e6 vehicle. She also thinks that we could reach out to other organizations on campus to see if they would also like to fund the purchase of a new SNAP vehicle. President Mardis thinks this would be a great idea, but she is also hesitant because she would like to complete this within a relatively quick timeframe.
- Freshman Forum Advisor Ballenger believes the GEM e6 is the best option, and that we should purchase this vehicle.
- Senator Moore believes that there will not be as much of an issue with mobility as there is the benefit that this vehicle will provide for students being chauffeured on the roads instead of walkways.
- Chief of Staff Britton thinks it is great that these vehicles can go on the roads and keep up with traffic.
- Senator McDonald thinks this vehicle will be great for students who are carrying groceries to their dorms.
- Senator Mwaura asks if we are still considering having pick-up locations where the vehicles can pick up students.
- Senator Vezina believes the bigger vehicle is more beneficial, because it will not be having to make as many loops due to seat capacity being larger.
- Senator Huffman is in favor of the bigger battery for the vehicle but asks if there will be the same amount of mileage. This is something that will have to be calculated at a later date.
- Senator Strickland asks if this vehicle can go to the classes that are located downtown instead of the main campus.
- Freshman Forum Advisor Anthony does not see why going downtown will be an issue for these vehicles.
- President Mardis provides updates on the pricing for each of the batteries available for these vehicles.
- Senator Joyner asks if SNAP will only pick up students from campus-related areas in downtown Florence.
- The Senate will now take an informal vote on the purchasing of these vehicles.
- The Senate unanimously approved the informal vote for the purchasing of the GEM e6 vehicle.
